

**OUTDOOR ART LEAGUE dedicates sun dial at Zachary Taylor National Cemetery.**

A bronze sun dial, on a pedestal of silver gray marble, winged with two circular seats, was dedicated at the Zachary Taylor National Cemetery by members of the Outdoor Art League Saturday afternoon, to commemorate the league's assistance in obtaining and beautifying the tract.

In the dedicatory address, Congressman Maurice H. Thatcher reviewed enactments by Congress and the State Legislature and co-operation by county officials and members of the league—"all of which combined to give us this beautiful resting place, this sacred, historic and unique spot which shall endure as long as our Republic shall endure."

The programme was conducted in front of the limestone mausoleum where Maj. Gen. Zachary Taylor, twelfth President of the United States, is buried.

Miss Amelia E. Laver outlined the league's part in urging the establishment of a national cemetery. Mrs. Charles F. Huhlein was president of the league when the movement was started. Three other presidents carried on the work until the cemetery was dedicated May 31, 1928. They were Mrs. Joseph N. Grant, Mrs. George H. Webb and Mrs. John H. Miller.

Ferdinand Gnau, member of the State Legislature in 1928, described the State's moves to obtain Federal aid. Rowan Hardin spoke for Mayor William B. Harrison, who was out of the city.

A vocal solo, "There Is No Death," by Mrs. Pleasant Brooks; a pledge to the flag, led by Mrs. George R. Peak; a prayer by the Rev. Dr. Homer Carpenter, pastor of the First Christian Church, and taps, sounded by Louis M. Engleman, completed the ceremony.

Mrs. Charles D. Greer was chairman, in the absence of Mrs. Soren Thurstensen, president of the league.
